WHOLE SCHOOL INFORMATION



FREE SCHOOL MEALS AND THE KNAVESMIRE OFFER

If your family qualifies for free school meals (aside from the universal free school meals for Reception, Year 1 and Year 2) you will also qualify for The Knavesmire offer. This means, in addition to free school meals, families can be provided with:



- a school jumper <u>or</u> a school cardigan
- a school footwear voucher
- School milk
- one term free swimming travel costs
- two half-terms of free extra-curricular club participation
- free school trips
- negotiated costs for residential visits

Please come to the school office for a form so we can order your child's jumper/cardigan, shoe voucher and milk.

FREE SCHOOL MEALS ELIGIBILITY

Free School Meals are automatically applied to all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2. This entitlement can be extended to children where families are in receipt of certain benefits and earnings do not exceed a threshold. These benefits include:

Universal Credit, Income Support, Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance, Child Tax Credit (but not Working Tax Credit)

YEAR 1 MESSAGES

We have had a busy week in Year One! In Maths, we have been looking at counting in multiples of 10, exploring the language of equal and unequal as well as using repeated addition to find answers. In English, the children enjoyed creating 3 changes to the original story of Jack and the Beanstalk and they have written some brilliant sentences which we have loved reading. In Big Idea, we found out about what plants need to grow and how we can look after seeds and bulbs for them to become mature plants. Next Thursday afternoon, it will be Forest School for 1H. YEAR 2 MESSAGES

This week, year 2 have been learning more about Lego. We have looked at the manufacturing process of Lego as well as exploring the properties of plastic and other materials. We did an experiment to look at materials that are similar to Lego and which ones would be suitable to make our own Lego next week. In maths we have been recapping our time knowledge and we have made our own clocks which we can use at home to keep practicing. In English we have been continuing with our narrative unit by practicing our editing skills and planning our own narrative to write next week. Have a great weekend!

YEAR 3 MESSAGES

We have enjoyed putting and chipping in our Tri-Golf Pe lessons this week (despite the wind!). During our English lessons, we have focused on the importance of being specific when setting instructions. In Maths, we have looked at Roman numerals and how to tell the time on a analogue and digital clock (hour, half past, 5 minutes past etc). We have also converted between days, months and years. This week, we have carried on learning about food groups and eating a balanced diet. As part of this we designed and made our own scones. We are looking forward to our trip to Eureka! next Wednesday and we will study why we have skeletons and how they are useful next week. We will then move on to how our bodies move and how we digest food over the based on our learning from the trip. Maths homework is ONLINE this week. There is a task linked to telling the time and a 8x task. We will now cover more than one X table a week in class to continue to improve fluency. Spelling homework is homophones and there is a bonus SPaG quiz on Spelling Shed which will consolidate the learning we have been doing on conjunctions. Have a great weekend,

YEAR 4 MESSAGES

Year 4 have continued our Ancient Greece theme this week, with a particular focus on Ancient Greek life and the Olympics. The children have particularly enjoyed brushing up their distance running and sprinting skills in PE as part of this theme. In Writing, Year 4 have been developing their narrative-writing skills, using figurative language and speech to build up to the problem in their narratives about Hercules vs Hydra. They have used some wonderful similes, metaphors and onomatopoeia to create vivid images of the scene. In Maths, we have looked further into decimals. We have ordered and compared decimals, rounded to the nearest whole number and converted fractions to decimals. Next week within school, we will be sharing with the children what the expectations will be for the multiplication check (3rd-14th June) so that they are familiar with the setup. We will be practicing at every opportunity in school, but please can we ask that the children are practicing as much as they can at home in preparation. The Big Idea has been focused around what life was like for Ancient Greek children and what did the Ancient Greeks for for entertainment, featuring some Ancient Greek games. On Thursday 2nd May, we will be holding an Ancient Greek-themed day. Children will participate in a range of activities to deepen and enhance their knowledge and understanding of life then. Children are invited to come in dressed (if they wish) as an Ancient Greek citizen, a god/goddess or even a mythical creature. These do not need to be elaborate - just a large t-shirt with a belt tied around will be fine!

This week, Year 5 explored the local area by conducting some fieldwork along Bishopthorpe Road and around Rowntree Park. In Rowntree Park, they had to identify and label human and physical features onto a map. All the children represented themselves amazingly on the trip and were a credit to the school! On Wednesday, we enjoyed hearing from Sam Wadstar who came in to talk to us about user experience. In Maths, we have been finding missing angles and in writing we have been creating leaflets about how to be an explorer. Unfortunately, we have had to say goodbye to Miss Downend (5U's student teacher) today as she has finished her final placement with us - good luck Miss Downend!

YEAR 6 MESSAGES

Year 6 have had a very busy week this week! In English, we have been creating mystery descriptions based on the very mysterious film 'Roads End'. The children's writing is amazing and has kept us on the edge of our seats reading it. In Maths, we have been revising angles, algebra and arithmetic strategies. In Big Idea, we have started our new Big Idea 'What Makes us Human?' Over the course of the week, we have conducted lots of experiments linked to the functions of the human body- the digestive system experiment was a particular hit as the children learnt what happens to their food once it is eaten. Homework this week will be arithmetic and SPAG revision.


