MRS GIBSON'S FRIDAY MESSAGE

Happy Friday everybody and welcome back to the autumn term! Gosh it has been so wonderful to have everyone back this week. It has felt so good walking around school all week - seeing all the children's beaming faces and seeing them playing beautifully together. We have spoken to several parents this week about concerns, or to answer questions, and we have received several emails too, so I'd like to clarify some points for everybody below:

No more bubbles: We're really pleased with how lovely it has felt in school this week and how happy the children have been, although we do understand that the decision to go back to our normal timetable was a challenging one for some of you. To *not* have phased break and lunch times has enabled the teachers to have freedom over their timetables again (as opposed to the fixed, set timetables that we had last year) and we are able to plan and start to run lunchtime clubs again. Changes such as these enable us to provide the enrichment and broad and balanced curriculum in the way that we used to, and we have truly missed it. This will provide essential to support pupil well-being, although we will keep reviewing our practice and school health and safety.

Playtimes have obviously felt busier but all the staff have been very positive about having the children altogether again. It's just such a long time since we have been able to do so that it feels strange, but equally wonderful. Mr Bentley is launching Zoneparc next week, which will enrich playtimes with fun playtime games and equipment and Year 5 and 6 are enjoying having sole use of the MUGA for their more active ball games. We are very mindful that many children have not experienced a 'whole school' playtime before but please be assured that the teachers have been working hard behind the scenes to prepare and check in with the children daily to see how they are finding the experience and overall, it has been a really positive experience.

Lunchtimes have equally had a very positive feel about them this week. The children go into the canteen in their classes/phases, so although a lot of you have had concerns about lunchtime, again, please rest assured that the children have been prepared and once they have eaten their lunch they are straight out to play. It's going well so far.

Assemblies: In our Monday email, I said that one of the things I was most looking forward to was conducting my whole school assemblies again, but many of you were very worried about this. We therefore changed our practice and instead we will have *Key Stage* Assemblies for now. I will do assembly for KS2 on a Friday and EY/KS1 on a Monday. It was lovely to see KS2 in assembly today, I have to admit to feeling rather emotional as I do love assemblies. It's such a precious time to bring us all together, share our celebrations and remind everyone of our core Knavesmire Character Values. We will aim to get back to a whole school assembly in time, but for now, Key Stages will be in the hall with all its doors and windows open.

The Playground We had a few teething problems at the start of the week with regard to a bottle neck feeling near the Lorne Street gate but we believe that this has eased with the return of the 'green' wavy line on the playground. Please can we remind anyone dropping off / collecting children from Year 1 and 2 to *stand behind this line* to reduce crowding and especially to enable the teachers to have better visibility for handover at the end of the school day. We would also like to remind parents that it is still a recommendation of the government to wear a face covering in enclosed and crowded spaces. If you feel that the playground is becoming rather busy in this way, you may wish to put your mask on, as I'm sure many of you still do at the supermarket etc.

<u>Revised Start time</u> We have seen a great improvement in children arriving before 9:00am as the week has gone on but we are still having many late arrivals, i.e. after 9:00am. Please can you aim to ensure that your child is in class, sitting down for registration, **at 9:00am** please. Thank you.

<u>Medication in school</u> Please see the school message below about **medication in school**, if your child requires medication in school, this is incredibly important. Thank you in advance for your cooperation with this.

I hope that this information helps you to understand how good our first week back to the autumn term has felt. We are all so happy to be back with all the pupils and school has a lovely feel to it. Here's to a fantastic term! Wishing you a great weekend whatever you are up to.

SCHOOL MESSAGES

<u>Late arrival</u> – Anyone arriving in school after the gates and doors close at **9.00 a.m**. must be signed in by an adult. The deadline for ordering a school lunch is 9.30 a.m. After this time you will need to provide a packed lunch.

<u>Medication in school</u> – If your child requires medication in school, for example an inhaler, epipen, insulin etc. you <u>MUST</u> complete a 'Permission to Administer Prescription Medication' form. Without this, we are unable to give your child any medication. There are a number of inhalers in school without completed forms. If you have not already done so, please

Cycle training consents – Year 5 and 6 cycle training consent forms were sent home with at the beginning of the week and need to be returned to the office ASAP. Replacement forms can be collected from Mrs Maxwell in the office on Monday, Wednesday or Friday.

Family Support Groups - We have recently been approached by some parents asking if we could help set up two support groups for families of children at Knavesmire. The first group would be for families of Adopted/Looked After children, and the second group for families of Autistic children. The aim would be to help parents and children within these groups make connections with other families in a similar position to offer friendship and support. These groups would initially take the form of a WhatsApp group with the potential for some scheduled get togethers down the line.

KCKC MESSAGES

Dear Parents/Carers

Welcome back to all our regulars and welcome to all new Parents and Children joining us this term. We hope that you have all had a great Summer!! KCKC just have a number of items we would like to remind/inform Parents about.

Bookings

All bookings are to be made via Arbor. Can all Parents please take the time to double check their Child/Children's portal on Arbor to ensure that they have correctly booked all required sessions for both Breakfast and After School Club. We have noticed that, especially in the case of siblings, children are not always booked in correctly. Where one sibling is booked in, the other/others are not. Whilst we appreciate that many Parents have regular sessions, it is your responsibility to ensure that they are booked correctly. We should never have to turn a Child/Children away, but if Staff/Child ratios are at capacity, then we may have to.

Cancellations

A member of KCKC can only do cancellations on Arbor. If you need to cancel a session, please contact KCKC by email. If less than 2 weeks' notice is received (term time), you will be charged at the standard rate for the session.

Invoices

KCKC invoices sessions in arrears, so any new Parents will receive their first invoice (for September) at the beginning of October. This will appear on ParentPay and Parents can pay through ParentPay, or if you have access to them, you may pay by Childcare vouchers. KCKC does not send a physical invoice to Parents. Can all current Parents please check ParentPay for any outstanding invoices. There are a number of invoices outstanding. The non-payment of invoices causes additional and unnecessary work for KCKC staff. KCKC invoices are due within 2 weeks of the day that they are added to ParentPay. This date should be visible to Parents when they view their invoice and should be adhered to.

YEAR 2 CLASS MESSAGES

We would like to say a huge 'WELL DONE' to all of the Year 2 children for being fantastic this week! We know that the change from Year 1 to 2 can sometimes be challenging but we have been really impressed with the confidence and kindness they have shown in their first week.

We have started our first Big Idea which is a book study of 'The Yeti and the Bird' by Nadia Shireen. Our end goal for the unit is to write and illustrate our own version of the story. In our English lessons, we have been drawing a story map so we can retell the story orally before we start writing our own version. This week, in Big Idea, we started learning about maps and we made our own map for the bird that gets lost in the story! Next week, we are going to be learning about compass directions.

In Maths, we have been revising numbers up to 20 and simple additions and subtractions.

You will shortly receive our half termly newsletter which will provide you with more Year 2 specific information, but here is a useful list of reminders for you:

Our PE lessons are on Monday afternoon and Tuesday morning. Please ensure your child has a named PE kit which is suitable for all weathers.

Please ensure your child has a named water bottle every day.

We will be sending your child home with a banded reading book once we have checked their colour band.
