<u>Maths</u>

This half-term, we will be looking at multiplication and division. This will include formal methods for both calculations. We will then be moving onto fractions.

To continue developing our Times Tables knowledge, we will be asking the children to learn all times tables facts – including multiplication and division facts. In school, this will be through daily practise and a weekly times table focus.

English

During our English lessons, the children will be learning how to write a diary, building on their skills from previous years. We will also be writing a discussion text. The two genres we are focusing on will link to our Big Ideas.
