This half term we will be moving onto Phase 3 graphemes - 'ai, we, igh, oo/oo, ar, or, ur, ow, oi, ear, air, er.'

Maths

In Maths we will be continuing to look at numbers up to 5 but we will be using these numbers to compare, add, subtract and build part/whole models with. We will also be looking at comparing and measuring mass and capacity.

English

In English we will continue to explore the many exciting media types that we find in everyday life. We will show the children how exciting reading and writing can be and as we become more secure in writing CVC words, we will explore meaningful sentences.

Big Idea

This half term we will be doing A Big Idea all about Penguins and trying to answer the question, 'Do all penguins live in cold places?' We will be looking into habitats and misconceptions that will arise throughout our journey. We are hoping that we will be able to enrich the children's learning with a school trip but we will need to closely follow any changes in regulations before we can confirm this. We are also looking forward to using the VR headsets and many more exciting activities! Handwriting

Last half term we learnt our Curly Catterpillar letters - c, a, o, d, g, q, e, s and f. Without this being correct, it can make writing all of the other letters very difficult. This half term we are looking at the long ladder letters - I, i, u, t, j and y.
